COMMUNITY RESOURCES
Montana Obstetric and Maternal Support (MOMS) Connects rural providers to obstetrical/gynecological, perinatal, mental health, and substance abuse specialists to build competency and consistency across perinatal providers.
Postpartum Resource Group (Flathead Area) – Support, advocacy, and resources.
Roots Family Collaborative (Bozeman) – Creates annual resource guide and offers regular programming.

TREATMENT PROGRAMS
Montana HealthCare Foundation's Meadowlark Initiative – Offers routine screening and treatment for substance use disorders and mental illness as a part of prenatal and postpartum care in at least one prenatal practice in each Montana community that has a hospital that provides obstetric services.
